TAKE ON ME

James Reimer made 41 saves for his third shutout of the season tonight. Reimer and **Petr Mrazek**, who has also posted three shutouts, are the first pair of Hurricanes goaltenders to each record at least three shutouts in the same season in franchise history. Carolina has also registered shutouts on back-to-back nights for the second time in franchise history and for the first time with two different goaltenders. Kevin Weekes accomplished the feat on 3/6/03-3/7/03.

ELECTRIC AVENUE

Teuvo Teravainen recorded two points tonight (1g, 1a) for his 10th multi-point game of the season and 59th of his career. He is the fourth Hurricanes skater to record at least 10 multi-point games this season, joining **Andrei Svechnikov** (13), **Sebastian Aho** (10) and **Dougie Hamilton** (10). Last season, only Teravainen (23) and Aho (20) earned at least 10 multi-point games for Carolina.

LET'S GO CRAZY

Sebastian Aho recorded an assist tonight to reach 40 points on the season (23g, 17a). The Hurricanes now have four skaters with at least 40 points through 45 games this season, as Aho is joined by **Andrei Svechnikov** (18g, 24a), **Teuvo Teravainen** (8g, 34a) and **Dougie Hamilton** (14g, 26a). This is the fourth time in franchise history that the Hurricanes have had four skaters record at least 40 points through the team's first 45 games of a season (1979-80, 1983-84, 2005-06). Carolina is one of three NHL teams who have four skaters with at least 40 points this season (TBL, WPG).

WITH OR WITHOUT YOU

Sebastian Aho and **Teuvo Teravainen** each registered an assist on Carolina's first goal tonight. They have now both factored into the scoring on the same goal 19 times this season. Either Aho or Teravainen has recorded a point on 64 of the Hurricanes' 148 goals in 2019-20 (43.2%).

THE SAFETY DANCE

Jacob Slavin played his 348th consecutive game tonight. He is now one game shy of tying Eric Staal for the second-longest ironman streak in franchise history. Slavin currently owns the seventh-longest active ironman streak in the NHL.

BURNING DOWN THE HOUSE

Tonight's attendance was a sellout figure of 18,680, marking Carolina's seventh sellout of the season. The Hurricanes are averaging 16,402 fans per game through 23 games at PNC Arena this season, for an increase of 20.1% over their average through 23 home games last season (13,656). During their seven-game homestand from 12/28-1/11, Carolina recorded four sellouts and averaged 17,755 fans per game.

GLORY DAYS

The Hurricanes wore their green Whalers throwback uniforms for the only time this season and the third time since relocating to North Carolina in 1997. The jerseys are modeled after Hartford's road uniforms worn between 1985-89 and again during the 1990-91 season. During those five seasons, the Whalers compiled a 186-180-34 record, captured their only division championship (1986-87) and earned their only playoff series win (1986 Adams Division Semifinals vs. Quebec). Overall, the Whalers compiled a 534-709-177 regular season record during their 18 NHL seasons in Hartford and an 18-31 record in eight playoff appearances, including seven straight playoff berths from 1986-92.

MY HOMETOWN

Tonight's game was the final game of a seven-game homestand for the Hurricanes (5-2-0 record), marking the team's fifth homestand of seven games or longer in franchise history. Carolina's last homestand of at least seven games was an eight-game stretch from 1/30/18-2/13/18, when they posted a 5-2-1 record.

TIME AFTER TIME

Carolina closed out their eighth of 16 sets of back-to-back games this season tonight. Entering tonight, the Hurricanes are now 6-2-0 in the first game and 5-3-0 in the second game of back-to-backs in 2019-20.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Carolina went 0-for-2 on the power play tonight and is now 32-for-142 (22.5%) on the man-advantage this season. The Hurricanes went 2-for-2 on the penalty kill and are now 131-for-159 (82.4%) on the kill this season.
- Los Angeles went 0-for-2 on the power play tonight and is now 21-for-139 (15.1%) on the man-advantage this season. The Kings went 2-for-2 on the penalty kill and are now 102-for-136 (75.0%) on the kill this season.
