- Justin Williams scored a goal tonight and has posted 10 points in his last nine games (2/10-3/1: 5g, 5a).
- Sebastian Aho tallied two points (1g, 1a) tonight and has registered 21 points in his last 17 games (1/20-3/1: 5g, 16a).
- Teuvo Teravainen posted two assists tonight and has recorded 23 points in his last 17 games (1/20-3/1: 8g, 15a).
- Justin Faulk registered two points (1g, 1a) tonight and has tallied four points in his last four games (2/21-3/1: 3g, 1a).
- Brett Pesce notched two assists tonight for his fourth multi-point game of the season and the eighth of his career.
- Jordan Staal scored a goal tonight and he has posted a point in all three games played since returning from injury (2/23-3/1: 1g, 4a).

NIEDERREITER ON THE STORM

Nino Niederreiter posted two assists tonight, reaching 40 points on the season for the third time in his career (18g, 22a). His two points tonight mark his sixth multi-point game since joining the Hurricanes. Niederreiter has recorded 17 points (9g, 8a) in 18 games with Carolina after registering 23 points (9g, 14a) in 46 games with Minnesota prior to the trade on 1/17.

SOMETHING'S FISHY

Sebastian Aho tallied a goal and an assist tonight to reach 72 points on the season (26g, 46a), which is the most points by a Hurricanes skater in one season since Eric Staal registered 76 points (33g, 43a) in 2010-11. Aho has recorded a point in 45 of Carolina's 64 games this season, and the Hurricanes are 29-11-5 when he records a point and 6-12-1 when he does not.

ANOTHER SHORTHY FOR SEABASS

Sebastian Aho scored his fourth shorthanded goal of the season, tying him for the league lead in the category. He becomes the seventh player in franchise history to record at least four shorthanded goals in one season. The last Hurricanes players to score four shorthanded goals in one season were Eric Staal and **Justin Williams**, who each accomplished the feat in 2005-06. The single-season franchise record is held by Kevyn Adams, who scored five shorthanded goals in 2003-04.

TURBO BOOST

Teuvo Teravainen recorded his 42nd and 43rd assists of the season tonight, which is a new single-season career high, surpassing the 41 assists he posted in 82 games last season.

DYNAMIC DUO

Sebastian Aho and **Teuvo Teravainen** each extended their point streaks to four games tonight (2/21-3/1). Aho has posted five points (2g, 3a) during the stretch, while Teravainen has tallied nine points (1g, 8a). The two players have now recorded a point on the same goal 39 times this season, and either Aho or Teravainen has tallied a point on 94 of Carolina's 191 goals this season (49.2%).

BACK IN BLACK

The Hurricanes wore their black third jerseys tonight for the 13th of 15 times this season. Carolina debuted the jerseys in an 8-5 win vs. NYR (10/7), and they are now 10-1-2 this season when wearing their new alternate uniforms.

GOING BACK-TO-BACK

Carolina opened their 13th of 17 sets of back-to-back games tonight. The Hurricanes are now 5-5-3 in the first game and 8-3-1 in the second game of back-to-backs.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Carolina went 0-for-2 on the power play today and is now 37-for-210 (17.6%) on the man-advantage this season. The Hurricanes went 3-for-3 on the penalty kill and are now 162-for-199 (81.4%) on the kill this season.
- St. Louis went 0-for-3 on the power play today and is now 36-for-190 (18.9%) on the man-advantage this season. The Blues went 2-for-2 on the penalty kill and are now 157-for-193 (81.3%) on the kill this season.
