- Derek Ryan opened the scoring with his 12th goal of the season and was tied for first on the team in shots (4).
- With an assist on Ryan's second period goal, Victor Rask has notched an assist in three of his last four games (2/24-3/2: 0g, 3a).
- Noah Hanifin tallied his 20th assist of the season and leads all team defensemen with 28 points in 2017-18. Hanifin is one point shy from matching his career high in points (29), set last season.
- Teuvo Teravainen gave the Hurricanes a 2-1 lead in the third frame and has scored a goal in a career-high three straight games (2/27-3/2: 3g, 1a).
- Justin Williams scored an empty-net goal and has registered four points in his last two games (3/1-3/2: 3g, 1a).
- Jordan Staal has recorded an assist in two consecutive games (3/1-3/2: 0g, 2a) and won 13-of-21 (62.0%) faceoffs against the Devils. Staal also paced the Canes on Friday with six hits.
- The Hurricanes are 24-8-5 when scoring first in 2017-18.

WARD SAYS NO

Cam Ward has earned a point in nine of his last 12 starts (1/25-3/2: 7-3-2). Since Nov. 10, Ward is 18-7-4 with two shutouts, a 2.52 goals-against average and a .910 save-percentage in 31 games played. He also is tied for third in fewest goals against (75) among all NHL goalies during that span (min. 30 GP).

SHOTS FIRED

Carolina has registered 30-or-more shots in 12 of their last 16 games (1/30-3/2) and is ranked tied for third in the NHL in shots per game (34.1) this season. In addition, the Hurricanes are ranked first in fewest shots against per game (28.7) this season and are the only team in the NHL to place in the top-5 in both shots for and shots against.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Carolina was 0-for-1 on the power play tonight and is 38-for-200 (19.0%) on the man-advantage this season. The Hurricanes were 2-for-3 on the penalty kill and are 123-for-155 (79.4%) on the kill this season.
- New Jersey was 1-for-3 on the power play tonight and is now 40-for-199 (20.1%) on the man-advantage this season. The Devils were 1-for-1 on the penalty kill and are now 177-for-214 (82.7%) on the kill this season.
