SEABASS EXTENDS HIS STREAK

Sebastian Aho recorded an assist tonight to extend his point streak to five games (5/1-5/14: 3g, 4a). Including regular season and postseason, Aho has registered a point in each of his last eight games against the Bruins (2/27/18-5/14/19: 6g, 6a).

THAT'S A FIRST

Calvin de Haan scored his first career playoff goal tonight while playing in his 27th career postseason game. Prior to 2019, de Haan appeared in 16 total games with NYI during the 2015 and 2016 Stanley Cup Playoffs.

RETURN OF THE MAC

Curtis McElhinney returned to the lineup tonight after dressing as the backup goaltender in Games 1 and 2. Following tonight's game, McElhinney has stopped 100 of 106 shots faced this postseason for a 1.70 goals-against average and .943 save percentage. His three previous appearances prior to tonight's game came during Carolina's Second Round series against the Islanders.

SHOOT YOUR SHOT

Carolina outshot Boston 20-6 in the first period, marking their most shots in a playoff period since 4/21/09, when they scored one goal on 22 shots in the second period vs. NJD (Martin Brodeur). The Hurricanes outshot the Bruins 36-31 tonight, led by **Justin Williams** (6) and **Dougie Hamilton** (6).

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Carolina went 0-for-5 on the power play tonight and is now 5-for-50 (10.0%) on the man-advantage this postseason. The Hurricanes went 4-for-5 on the penalty kill and are now 34-for-48 (70.8%) on the kill this postseason.
- Boston went 1-for-5 on the power play tonight and is now 15-for-47 (31.9%) on the man-advantage this postseason. The Bruins went 5-for-5 on the penalty kill and are now 42-for-49 (85.7%) on the kill this postseason.
