

- -- Sebastian Aho (1g, 1a) posted the 27th multi-point game of his career.
- -- Warren Foegele and Jordan Staal each scored their team-leading third goal of the season.
- -- Brett Pesce scored his first goal of the season in the first period. It marked his first goal since Feb. 15, 2018, a span of 18 games.
- -- Jordan Staal (1g, 1a) posted the 95th multi-point game of his career (51st with Carolina).
- -- Teuvo Teravainen (2a) posted the 27th multi-point game of his career (21st with Carolina) and 12th multi-assist game of his career (10th with Carolina).
- -- Justin Williams recorded his fourth assist in his last two games, tying him for the team lead this season with Sebastian Aho.

GOING STREAKING

Sebastian Aho recorded a goal and an assist, extending his season-opening point/assist streak to four games (2g, 4a). Teuvo Teravainen tallied a pair of assists in the first period, extending his point streak to three games (1g, 3a). Micheal Ferland added an assist on Aho's goal to extend his point/assist streak to three games (2g, 3a). Andrei Svechnikov scored for the second straight game to extend his point streak to three games (2g, 2a).

HOT START

The Hurricanes have earned points in four straight games to open the season for the second time in franchise history, and their seven points (3-0-1) through four games is the second-highest mark in franchise history (1995-96: 4-0-0).

GOALS GALORE

With four goals tonight, the Hurricanes have now scored 17 goals through their first four games this season, marking the third-highest total through four games in franchise history (1985-86: 18; 1989-90: 18) and most since the Whalers scored 17 in their first four games of the 1996-97 season (3-1-0).

SHOOTING RANGE

The Hurricanes have now outshot their opponents in 11-of-12 regulation periods this season, and 154-101 overall through four games.

BIG MAC

Curtis McElhinney made 22 saves to improve to 2-0-0 with the Hurricanes, winning consecutive appearances for the first time since March 14-17, 2018 (3-0-0).

FLEURY ENTERS THE FOLD

Haydn Fleury made his season debut tonight for the Hurricanes. Fleury registered eight assists in 67 games in 2017-18.

BIRTHDAY BOY

Phil Di Giuseppe is celebrating his 25th birthday today. This is the first time Di Giuseppe has played on his birthday in his professional career.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Carolina went 0-for-2 on the power play tonight and is now 1-for-10 (10.0%) on the man-advantage this season. The Hurricanes went 2-for-4 on the penalty kill and are now 10-for-14 (71.4%) on the kill this season.
- Vancouver went 2-for-4 on the power play tonight and is now 4-for-11 (36.4%) on the man-advantage this season. The Canucks went 2-for-2 on the penalty kill and are now 12-for-15 (80.0%) on the kill this season.
