CAROLINA HURRICANES SCORING NOTES

- With 1:25 left in regulation, Carolina forward Jeff Skinner found the back of the net to tie the game 1-1. This marked Skinner's first goal of the season, and he led all skaters on Tuesday with five shots on goal. In 2016-17, Skinner led the Hurricanes with five points (2g, 3a) in four games against the Blue Jackets.
- In his second NHL game, defenseman Haydn Fleury led the team with five hits.
- Carolina blueliner Justin Faulk led all Canes skaters with 27:13 of ice time.
- With a point on Tuesday, the Hurricanes have now earned at least a point in eight of the last nine games (5-1-3) against the Blue Jackets at PNC Arena, dating back to 1/27/2014. In addition, with a point on Tuesday, the Hurricanes have earned a point in each of their first two games of a season (1-0-1) for the first time since the 2010-11 season (2-0-0).
- Scott Darling stopped 25 of 27 shots.

HOT ON THE DOT

Carolina earned a 61.0% faceoff win-percentage on Tuesday vs. Columbus. Hurricanes forwards **Derek Ryan** and **Jordan Staal** led all skaters with a 73.0% faceoff win-percentage (min. 5 faceoffs). In 2016-17, Staal led the team with a career-high 59.1% faceoff win-percentage (min. 50 faceoffs), and ranked fifth in the League (min. 100 faceoffs).

400 FOR KRUGS

Carolina forward **Marcus Kruger** skated in his 400th NHL game tonight vs. Columbus. Kruger has tallied 106 points (33g, 73a) in 400 career games, and notched his first Hurricanes point with an assist in his Carolina debut on Saturday vs. MIN.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Carolina was 0-for-3 on the power play on Tuesday and is now 1-for-8 (12.5%) on the man-advantage this season. The Hurricanes were 3-for-3 on the penalty kill and are 5-for-6 (83.3%) on the kill this season.
- Columbus was 0-for-3 on the power play on Tuesday and is now 1-for-7 (14.3%) on the man-advantage this season. The Blue Jackets were 3-for-3 on the penalty kill and are now 5-for-6 (83.3%) on the kill this season.
