**Postgame Notes – Oct. 29, 2017**



**CAROLINA HURRICANES SCORING NOTES**

-- With seven seconds left in the first frame, Jeff Skinner put the Canes on the board with his team-leading seventh goal of the season. Skinner has scored seven goals in 10 games this season, marking the most goals he has scored through the first 10 games of a season in his career. He has also recorded a point in three straight games (10/26-10/29; 2g, 1a), and scored a goal in two straight games (10/27-10/29; 2g).

-- Noah Hanifin notched his fourth assist of the season against Anaheim. Hanifin now leads all team blueliners in assists (4) in 2017-18.

-- Justin Faulk scored his first goal of the season in the second period to give the Hurricanes a 3-2 lead. Faulk was tied for first on the team on Sunday with six shots on goal.

-- With his fifth assist of the season vs. the Ducks, Sebastian Aho is now ranked second on the team in assists. Aho has recorded four points (1g, 3a) in three career games against Anaheim.

-- With an assist on Faulk's goal, Justin Williams leads the team with six assists this season and has now tallied an assist in two straight games (10/27-10/29; 0g, 2a).

-- Jordan Staal scored a goal, led the team with four hits, tallied three shots, and was (+1) in 18:55 of ice time.

-- Jaccob Slavin paced the Canes with three blocked shots and 23:30 of ice time.

**THE SKINNY SPECIAL**

**Jeff Skinner** scored his second power-play goal of the season on Sunday against Anaheim. Skinner is now seven power-play goals shy from passing **Ron Francis** (49) for fourth on Carolina's all-time power-play goals list (since relocation). Last season, he led the team with seven power-play goals and the Hurricanes are 22-11-4 all-time in games when Skinner scores a power-play goal. Carolina has now scored power-play goals in their last two games against Anaheim, dating back to 12/7/2016.

**STRANGERS TO THE SIN BIN**

The Hurricanes played their second straight penalty-free game on Sunday vs. Anaheim. This is the first time in franchise history that the team has gone penalty-free in two straight games. Carolina leads the NHL in fewest penalty minutes per game (4:35) and ranks second in fewest minor penalties per 60 minutes (2.29). In 2016-17, the Canes played five penalty free games.

**PICKING UP A POINT**

Carolina earned a point against Anaheim on Sunday, marking the first point the Hurricanes have earned against the Ducks at PNC Arena since a 3-2 shootout win on Nov. 15, 2013.

## SPECIAL TEAMS

- Carolina was 1-for-3 on the power play tonight and is 6-for-35 (17.1%) on the man-advantage this season. The Hurricanes were 0-for-0 on the penalty kill and are 16-for-20 (80.0%) on the kill this season.
- Anaheim was 0-for-0 on the power play tonight and is 4-for-33 (12.1%) on the man-advantage this season. The Ducks were 2-for-3 on the penalty kill and are now 43-for-51 (84.3%) on the kill this season.
