### DOUG DYNASTY

**Dougie Hamilton** scored his seventh goal of the season tonight, tying him with John Carlson (WSH) for the league lead in goals by a defenseman this season. Hamilton has now scored 25 goals in 98 career Hurricanes games, and his 0.26 goals per game is the highest average among defensemen in franchise history (min. 50 GP).

### CZECH IT OUT

**Martin Necas** recorded an assist tonight to extend his point streak to four games (11/1-11/7: 1g, 3a). This marks his second four-game point streak of the season, after earning a point in four straight games from 10/8-10/15 (1g, 3a).

### MEET THE NEW GUY

**Eetu Luostarinen** made his NHL/Hurricanes debut tonight, becoming the second Hurricanes player to make his NHL debut in 2019-20 (**Julien Gauthier**). Luostarinen has registered seven points (5g, 2a) in 10 AHL games with the Checkers this season, and ranks tied for third among AHL rookies in goals.

### KEGG STAND

Greg McKeeg faced the Hurricanes for the first time since leaving in free agency during the offseason. He registered career highs in goals (6), assists (5) and points (11) while playing in 41 regular season games with Carolina in 2018-19. McKeeg added two goals in 14 playoff games, including the game-winning goal in the Hurricanes' series-clinching win in Game 4 of the Eastern Conference Second Round vs. NYI (5/3).

### SHOOT YOUR SHOT

The Hurricanes outshot the Rangers 47-19 tonight, marking their most shots for in a game this season. Carolina outshot New York 22-6 in the first period, marking the first time this year that they have recorded at least 20 shots in a period. Last season, when the Hurricanes averaged a league-high 34.4 shots per game, they registered at least 20 shots in a single period 10 times.

### SPECIAL TEAMS

- Carolina went 0-for-2 on the power play today and is now 11-for-51 (21.6%) on the man-advantage this season. The Hurricanes went 1-for-2 on the penalty kill and are now 47-for-59 (79.7%) on the kill this season.
- New York went 1-for-2 on the power play today and is now 11-for-50 (22.0%) on the man-advantage this season. The Rangers went 2-for-2 on the penalty kill and are now 43-for-53 (81.1%) on the kill this season.
