-- Trevor van Riemsdyk opened the scoring with his first goal of the season.

-- Justin Williams scored 22 seconds after van Riemsdyk, giving the Hurricanes captain goals in back-to-back games.

-- Micheal Ferland's power-play goal increased his team-leading totals in goals (11) and power-play goals (5).

-- Jordan Staal posted two assists, marking the 95th multi-point game of his career (51st with Carolina) and the 37th multi-assist game of his career (27th with Carolina).

CENTURY MARK

Justin Williams scored his 100th career Hurricanes goal in the first period, making him the ninth player in NHL history to score at least 100 goals and win the Stanley Cup with multiple franchises. Williams, a three-time Stanley Cup Champion, has scored 100 goals in 368 games with Carolina and recorded 103 goals in 427 games for LAK.

RASK IS BACK

Victor Rask made his season debut tonight after missing the first 20 games of the season following hand surgery. Rask posted 31 points (14g, 17a) in 71 games for the Hurricanes last season.

SOMETHING'S FISHY

With his goal tonight, **Sebastian Aho** has registered 24 points (7g, 17a) through 21 games this season. Last season, when Aho set a career high with 65 points (29g, 36a), he recorded his 24th point in his 35th game.

SHOOT YOUR SHOT

The Hurricanes outshot the Maple Leafs 29-11 in the first period, marking the most single-period shots on goal by Carolina in team history (since relocation). The Hurricanes' 29 shots are also the most in a first period in the NHL since 1997-98. Carolina has now outshot opponents in 50 of 63 regulation periods and posted at least 10 shots in 50 of 63 regulation periods. **Dougie Hamilton** tallied three shots tonight and now has recorded a shot in 186 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the NHL. Seventeen different Hurricanes registered a shot tonight, led by **Andrei Svechnikov** (8), as Carolina registered over 40 shots for the 12th time this season.

HEAVY HITTERS

Carolina outhit Toronto 32-22 tonight. **Micheal Ferland** led the Hurricanes with nine hits and now ranks fourth in the NHL with a team-high 73 hits this season.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Carolina went 1-for-1 on the power play tonight and is now 12-for-72 (16.7%) on the man-advantage this season. The Hurricanes went 2-for-2 on the penalty kill and are now 50-for-67 (74.6%) on the kill this season.
- Toronto went 0-for-2 on the power play tonight and is now 15-for-60 (25.0%) on the man-advantage this season. The Maple Leafs went 0-for-1 on the penalty kill and are now 46-for-57 (80.7%) on the kill this season.
