WE'RE GOING STREAKING

Andrei Svechnikov scored a goal in the second period to extend his point streak to four games (4g, 1a). **Justin Faulk** and **Calvin de Haan** each tallied an assist tonight, extending their assist streaks to three games each. Faulk has tallied three assists during his streak and de Haan has posted four assists.

SVECH ME OUTSIDE

Andrei Svechnikov's second-period goal tied him with Brady Tkachuk for the second-most goals by a rookie this season (10) and the fourth-most points by a rookie (18).

WELCOME BACK

Jordan Staal and **Micheal Ferland** returned to the lineup tonight. Staal missed the last five games (12/7-12/16), while Ferland missed seven of the last eight games (11/30-12/7 and 12/13-12/16). Carolina went 2-2-1 without Staal in the lineup and 2-3-2 without Ferland.

SHOOT YOUR SHOT

The Hurricanes outshot the Red Wings 39-24 tonight. Carolina has now outshot opponents in 70 of 99 regulation periods and recorded at least 10 shots in 75 of 99 regulation periods this season. **Dougie Hamilton** tallied two shots tonight and has now recorded at least one shot on goal in 198 consecutive games, which is the longest active streak in the NHL.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Carolina went 0-for-2 on the power play tonight and is now 19-for-114 (16.7%) on the man-advantage this season. The Hurricanes went 0-for-1 on the penalty kill and are now 81-for-101 (80.2%) on the kill this season.
- Detroit went 1-for-1 on the power play tonight and is now 18-for-92 (19.6%) on the man-advantage this season. The Red Wings went 2-for-2 on the penalty kill and are now 97-for-123 (78.9%) on the kill this season.
