MARTY SETS A RECORD

Jordan Martinook's goal at 0:06 of the second period marked the fastest goal at the start of a period in franchise history. Ron Francis held the previous record, scoring eight seconds into the third period of an 11-0 Hartford win vs. Edmonton on 2/12/84.

1,200 FOR THE CAPTAIN

Justin Williams played his 1,200th career NHL game tonight, becoming the fifth active player (110th all-time) to reach the milestone. Williams joins Scott Hartnell as the only players selected in the 2000 NHL Draft to reach 1,200 career games played.

SVECH ME OUTSIDE

Andrei Svechnikov scored a goal tonight and he now leads the 2018 Draft class and ranks second among all rookies in goals this season with 11.

BIG MAC

Curtis McElhinney played his 200th career NHL game tonight. McElhinney also made his 14th start of the season, marking the earliest date that he has made his 14th start of a season in his NHL career.

MAKING THE KILL

The Hurricanes have killed 50 of 55 opponents' power plays over their last 19 games (90.9%). In their first 19 games this season, Carolina's penalty kill ranked 29th in the NHL at 72.6% (45 of 62), and they now rank 11th at 81.2% (95 of 117).

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Carolina went 0-for-2 on the power play tonight and is now 19-for-132 (14.4%) on the man-advantage this season. The Hurricanes went 2-for-2 on the penalty kill and are now 95-for-117 (81.2%) on the kill this season.
- Philadelphia went 0-for-2 on the power play tonight and is now 14-for-111 (12.6%) on the man-advantage this season. The Flyers went 2-for-2 on the penalty kill and are now 92-for-123 (74.9%) on the kill this season.
